Quality of Work Index 2023

on working time, commuting and work-life balance

The 2023 data collection for the Quality of work Index Luxembourg of the Chamber of employees Luxembourg (CSL) in cooperation with the University of Luxembourg has already started. As in previous years, the infas Institut für angewandte Sozialwissenschaften (Bonn, Germany) has been commissioned to collect data on the working conditions and well-being of workers in the Grand Duchy. This year, we want to find out more specifically how respondents experience and evaluate the issues of working hours, commuting and work-life balance in their everyday working lives.

About 2,000 panel members were contacted for telephone interviews. In addition, 16,000 people were randomly selected from the official register by the General Inspectorate of Social Security (IGSS). These will receive a letter inviting them to participate in the survey. They then have the choice of conducting a telephone interview or filling out the questionnaire online via the Internet. Participation is of course voluntary. The results of the survey are evaluated and presented strictly anonymously (i.e. without names and contact details).

Participation in the survey takes less than 30 minutes on average. The survey is aimed at workers aged 16-64 who regularly work at least 10 hours per week and are resident in Luxembourg or cross-border workers from Germany, France or Belgium.

For the Chamber of employees, reliable information is very important to understand how workers experience the ever-changing world of work and thus to be able to advocate for the improvement of their working conditions. We count on the support of the people contacted and thank them in advance
